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





- Area: Around 1,985 sq km largest protected area in the Eastern Himalayas and fourth-largest National Park in India by area
- The first three are <u>Hemis National Park</u> in Ladakh, <u>Desert National Park</u> in Rajasthan, and <u>Gangotri National Park</u> in Uttarakhand.
- Altitude Range: From 200 m to 4,500 m, covering tropical to alpine ecosystems
- It is also on the Tentative Lists of <u>UNESCO</u> <u>World Heritage Sites</u> in India.

Declared a National Park in 1981.






